2010 CHRISTMAS IN NOVEMBER AT HUNTLEY MANOR



On Saturday 20th November 2010, the Garden Club of Bermuda held an open house at Huntley Manor. This historic home on Tanglewood Lane in Paget is a grand Victorian house built in 1891 by Welshman Colonel Vulliamy and his Bermudian wife Lillian Isobel Gosling. Although it was constructed of Bermuda stone, its battlements, red tiled roof, narrow leaded windows and stepped gables are reminiscent of a British country home.

The house has had many owners over the years and has a colourful history. During the Second World War Huntley Manor was used to inter enemy nationals.

The present house still retains its baronial proportions with four-metre ceilings, hardwood floors, beautiful architectural details, an oak staircase, a grand salon, music and powder rooms, a separate bar, a large balcony overlooking the pool and a lovely terrace facing the Great Sound. A separate tree house was also open to the public.
